Sixteen rebel deserters were brought to New Haven Sunday by speculators for the purpose of eliciting.

Lieut. Babcock, aid to Gen. Hurlburt, has communicated of the audacity of his act, hastened to report to the General at St. Louis, and tendered him the post of Major in the 1st Connecticut. He was rejected.

Major George O. Marey publishes a card showing that he has received no official notification of the result of his trial by court martial in which he was cashiered. He was discharged from the U. S. service as captain of the 11th of February last, and was subsequently re-enlisted as major of the 1st Connecticut cavalry. He had received an order from the President removing all command exercised by the commandant of the outfit, and retaining him in the service as major. This followed the President's orders.
